



Dear PBJ friends and family, it always gives me great joy to share our accomplishments of the past year, which have enriched the lives of animals we've rescued and the people who love them – all made possible by your unwavering support!

PBJ is honored to serve our community by bringing joy to people and pets through rescue, adoption, and community service. 2024 was our IIth year of operation as a non-profit rescue organization, and as of today we've found loving adoptive homes for 249 deserving animals so far this year -- 3,970 animals in total since our launch in 2013. The animals that we rescue come to us from overcrowded shelters, as strays or "community cats" by way of our TNR partners and community members, and through our owner assistance program, which provides help and hope to families struggling with decisions on giving up their pets.

PBJ believes that everyone in our community deserves to experience the joy that comes from communing with animals, whether through adopting, fostering, or volunteering. We're incredibly thankful for our foster families who care for rescued cats while they await forever homes, and for our team of dedicated volunteers who help with adoption events, cat care at our PetSmart and PetMAC adoption venues, transporting cats, and a myriad of administrative tasks.

We couldn't accomplish these good works without your support!!!

As is true for all rescue organizations, the average cost for rescuing an animal significantly exceeds what we are comfortable charging as adoption fees. PBJ incurs a deficit of \$387 per animal, which can only be covered through grants and charitable donations. We look forward to carrying on our rescue mission with help from wonderful people like you! Please take a peek at a bit of important math below.

Rescue math: *

- YTD, we've saved 249 animals.
- We've brought in \$33K from adoption fees ... an average of \$134 per animal.
- We've spent \$130K on rescuing and placing animals ... an average of \$521 per cat.
- Deficit per animal adopted: \$387
